Opere complete: XI: Recensioni di libri (1950-1959) Apr 16 2021 Questo volume – che inaugura la pubblicazione in formato elettronico delle Opere complete di Bruno Leoni – include tutte le 408 recensioni scritte per la rivista “Il Politico” nel corso di un decennio (1950-1959). A sorprendere non è soltanto l'elevato numero di recensioni, ma anche la diversità degli argomenti trattati: dalla psichiatria all'arte, dalla religione alla letteratura, dall'archeologia alle civiltà orientali, dalla storia all'architettura, oltre naturalmente alla politica, all'economia e al diritto. Si tratta di un testo utile per due motivi in particolare. Da un lato per capire meglio il pensiero di Leoni, poiché in queste recensioni i suoi riferimenti culturali vengono esplicitati e si chiarisce bene quale fosse la sua concezione della politica, della filosofia e della società. Dall'altro esso consente di farsi un'idea sugli argomenti di cui (non) si discuteva in Italia negli anni Cinquanta. “Il Politico” – fondato dallo stesso Leoni nel 1950 – fu infatti un mirabile tentativo di innovare la cultura italiana e in queste recensioni, che sono per la maggior parte di libri stranieri, l'Autore suggerisce traduzioni e propone idee e argomenti in Italia

allora poco conosciuti, o spesso conosciuti male. Le recensioni non sono mai banali, e anzi vi emerge con chiarezza quali siano le valutazioni, le idee e in generale il pensiero di Leoni. Fare esplorazioni in campi così diversi e saperne trarre vantaggio nell'elaborazione di idee nel proprio settore di ricerca richiede indubbiamente un'intelligenza e una cultura fuori dall'ordinario. Ma questo era il suo approccio metodologico: le scienze umane gli apparivano intimamente connesse e solo da una loro trattazione comune era convinto di poter trovare la soluzione ai problemi sociali.

*Canon 1096 on Ignorance with Application to Tribunal and Pastoral Practice Jun 18 2021 Before Vatican II, marriage was often considered, or at least popularly expressed, as a union of bodies; that is to say, marriage was an exclusive contract by which a man and a woman mutually handed over their bodies for the purpose of acts which led to the procreation of children. Matrimonial jurisprudence was primarily focused on this marital contract. With the advent of Vatican II and its emphasis on the personalist notion of marriage, a new age dawned whereby canonists, especially auditors of the Roman Rota, were henceforth to view marriage as a union of persons. "Person" is more than a "body"; rather, a person is an individual consisting of wants, needs, desires, impulses, hopes and dreams, whose life experience has been shaped by the milieu "cultural, familial, religious" from which he or she comes. "Union" is not only simply understood as a "contract", but also is now once again recognized as a "covenant", a concept which, at least in the Latin Church, was prevalent until the 12th century. One of the canons of the 1983 CIC, although almost identical in wording to its predecessor in the 1917 CIC, but which now must be understood and interpreted in light of the teachings of Vatican II, is canon 1096 which pertains to the effect of ignorance on matrimonial consent. Given the current appreciation of marriage founded in the teachings of Vatican II, especially in *Gaudium et spes*, reiterated by Popes Paul VI and John Paul II and described in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, complicated by today's western society's stress on individualism and permeated by a divorce mentality, what is the impact of this canon on matrimonial consent? How can its meaning, once understood as being wider than merely the sexual act itself, be better utilized by those in tribunal ministry? This is the major thrust of the present work. The research of the history and development of the concept of ignorance in canonical writings, how its understanding broadened especially after Vatican II and our conclusions on how to apply its richness to marriage nullity led us to expand the use of this canon: how it can aid in the development of pre-marital preparation programs which would not only possibly help prevent couples from being ignorant of the essence of marriage but also help them to appreciate this richness more deeply in their own lives so that marriage truly can become, as we read in canon 1055, "a partnership of the whole of life which is ordered by its nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring". It is our sincere hope that this study, with its extensive footnotes and up-to-date bibliography will not only be of benefit to all who read it but also will serve as a spring board for further discussion and use of this canon as a ground for nullity and other pastoral uses.*

They range from full recognition of same-sex marriage to full invisibility of gay and lesbian individuals and their families. The broad spectrum of experiences presented in this book share some commonalities: in all of them legal scholars and civil society are moving legal boundaries or thinking of spaces within rigid legal systems for same-sex families to function. In all of them there have been legal claims to recognize the existence of same-sex families. The difference between them lies in the response of courts. Regardless of the type of legal system, when courts have viewed claims of same-sex couples and their families as problems of individual rights, they have responded with a constitutional narrative protecting same-sex couples and their families. Today more than 30 countries have granted rights to same sex couples, including several that have opened up marriage to couples of the same sex. Every day there is a new bill being discussed or a new claim being brought to courts seeking formal recognition of same sex couples. Not all countries are open to changing their legal structures to accommodate same-sex couples, but even those with no visible changes are witnessing new voices in their communities challenging the status quo and envisioning more flexible legal systems.

Lack of Discretion of Judgment Because of Schizophrenia Feb 24 2022 Pope Paul VI in his address

of February 12, 1968, to the Roman Rota made special reference to the contribution to be made to the renewal of the Code of Canon Law by the Rota's decisions. Speaking of decisions, he stated: By means of these the results successfully obtained by the most recent development to the civil law of the nations, as well as the data acquired by the science of medicine and of psychiatry, will filter into the new Code. One contribution, evident already at the time of the late Holy Father's address, was the application of the lasted findings in psychiatry to the understanding of marriage consent. Eventually, it would result in the addition of a new canon to the Code. Already by 1968 many studies, including several doctoral dissertations, had been written on the integration of new psychiatric knowledge and the Church's teaching on marriage consent in Rotal jurisprudence. Discussion and debate about the Rota's treatment of the effect of psychopathology on marriage consent continues to the present. The literature in the area is ample. Pope Paul VI concluded his remarks on the contribution of Rotal jurisprudence to the renewed Code: The profoundly human sense which inspires your Sentences will help to illuminate the mystery of man and of today's Christian, he, that is, who will be the recipient of the renewed Code, he to whom the new legislation will have to offer a clear plan and a sound help for living courageously the Gospel truths and his own vocation in the Church of Christ.

While the European Commission's draft for a Regulation on succession - which probably constitutes the most detailed and ambitious attempt ever to codify PIL in this area - begins its legislative process, a new initiative on the application of foreign law is being considered by the European institutions. Both of these developments are discussed in the Doctrine section. But the newest Yearbook of PIL also examines interesting developments taking place on other continents. For example, the present volume includes a special section focusing on Chinese PIL and reports on the renewed interest with conflict of laws in the U.S. doctrine.
